Responsible to: Senior Patrol Leader

Specific Duties:

- Acts as the Senior Patrol Leader in the absence of the Senior Patrol Leader
- Helps the Senior Patrol Leader lead meetings and activities
- Helps train the Patrol Leader, Assistant Patrol Leader, and Patrol Scribe
- Keeps the Senior Patrol Leader and Scoutmaster informed of any problems in the patrol
- Serves as a member of the Patrol Leaders' Council
- Sets the example
- Enthusiastically wears the Scout uniform correctly
- Lives by the Scout Oath and the Scout Law
- Shows Scout Spirit
