

Senior Patrol Leader Job Description

Introduction: When you were elected as Senior Patrol Leader, you agreed to provide leadership and service in our Troop. This responsibility should be fun and rewarding. This job description provides some of the things you are expected to do while serving as a junior leader.

Responsible to: Scoutmaster

Specific Duties:

- Runs all Troop meetings, events, activities, and the annual program planning conference
- Chairs meetings of the Patrol Leaders' Council
- Appoints Troop members to serve in the Troop's other junior leader positions (with the advice and counsel of the Scoutmaster)
- Delegates duties and responsibilities to other junior leaders
- Assists the Scoutmaster with Troop Junior Leader Training
- Sets the example
- Enthusiastically wears the Scout uniform correctly
- Lives by the Scout Oath and the Scout Law
- Shows Scout Spirit
